Walking in Lisbon

If you stay at a hotel in the Downtown area (Baixa), Avenida da Liberdade area or Chiado and Bairro Alto areas you can walk to all the venues (Parliament, Centro de Estudos Judiciários and Zambeze).

Please note that Lisbon is a very hilly city and is known for its "Portuguese Pavement" as well as cobble stone roads. Therefore please bear in mind that for walking distances (even 10 min walks) appropriate shoes should be used (high heels and slippery shoes should be avoided).

Pickpockets


Lisbon is a large and touristy city therefore you are strongly advised to watch for your wallet while walking in the Tourist areas or taking public transportation. Pickpockets are not violent, but they will take your wallet in seconds without being noticed.

You can enjoy a wonderful ride through the city's hills on tram 28E, but please be particularly careful with your pockets and wallet while using this line, since there are almost always pickpockets and they are true artists (beware of nice old ladies next to you!).

Public transport options to get to the Centro de Estudos Judiciários and the Zambeze restaurant


- If you take the metro (click on plan to go to website) use following stops:
- Rossio Station (550m to Zambeze and 900m to Centro de Estudos Judiciários)
 - Baixa Chiado Station (600m to Zambeze and 750m to Centro de Estudos Judiciários)
 - Terreiro do Paço Station (700m to Zambeze and 600m to Centro de Estudos Judiciários)

You can also take tramline 28E and get off at Limoeiro for Centro de Estudos Judiciários). Tickets cost 2,85€ (make sure you have small change).



Walking from the Centre for Judicial Studies to the Zambeze restaurant

It is a short walk from the Centre for Judicial Studies to the Zambeze restaurant. See below.



Going to the Parliament

In order to go from the Center to the Parliament, you can use the metro (get off at Rato stop on the yellow line and walk down Rua de São Bento, it's a 10 min walk).

You can also take tramline 28E towards Campo de Ourique (Prazeres) and get off at Rua de São Bento / Calçada da Estrela (R. S. Bento / Cç. Estrela). Tickets cost 2,85€ (make sure you have small change).

Alternative you can walk from the centre and take an 30-45 min walk enjoying the city and it's views:

Sightseeing

Tram 28E

You can enjoy a wonderful ride through the city's hills on tram 28E, but please be particularly careful with your pockets and wallet while using this line, since there are almost always pickpockets and they are true artists (beware of nice old ladies next to you!).

This tramline has stops near the Parliament, the Centro de Estudos Judiciários and not far from the Zambeze restaurant.

If you are staying in the Centre (Baixa) you can get on at the first stop (Martim Moniz) and take the whole ride until Campo de Ourique.

Tickets cost €2,85 and can be bought on board (please be sure to take small change).

Boat Trip

Just turn up at one of the scheduled times and buy a ticket on-site.

Far from the noise and rush of the city, it seems like you are standing in a floating stage with a privileged view to the "7 Hills City". While slowly sliding through the Tagus river surface on the Yellow Boat, you can observe the most important monuments and edifications such as the Saint Jorge Castle, the Sé Cathedral and the April 25th Bridge.
